General Objectives of the Programme:

- 1. To impart high quality of knowledge among the students, as per the guidelines given by NEP-2020
- 2. To prepare the students for variety of challenging careers through innovation in Teaching and research.
- 3. To develop comprehensive understanding of interdisciplinary and core issues of society.

1. Preamble:

Nehru Institute of Social Sciences is offering Master of Arts (M.A.) programme in four subjects namely, M.A. in Economics, M.A. in History, M.A. in Political Science and M.A. in Sociology. These programmes and the syllabus structure has been revised and designed as per the guidelines issued by National Education Policy-2020 (NEP-2020) of Government of India and as per the guidelines/resolutions forwarded by the government of Maharashtra for the implementation of NEP-2020. The new designed programme of M.A. based on NEP-2020 shall be applicable with effect from the academic 2024-25. This structure of syllabus includes semester and credit system, where research methodology and research projects are integral part of it.

General Highlights of the Programme/ Courses

- Based on National Education Policy-2020 introduced by Government of India
- Based on the Resolutions passed by Government of Maharashtra regarding the implementation of NEP-2020 in the state
- Research Training, On Job Training, Survey and Research Projects are integral part of the syllabus
- All Major Courses are mandatory or compulsory
- Student have to choose/select one course for each Semester from the elective courses
- Research Methodology is a compulsory course for First Semester
- On Job Training/ Field Project/Internship/ Apprenticeship is Compulsory for all students
- Research Project is compulsory

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2) Examination and Methods of Evaluation:

- **2.1** M.A. Programme (M.A. in Economics/M.A. in History/ M.A. in Political Science / M.A. in Sociology) shall have Four Semester End Examination (For Two Years M.A. Programme). The term-end examination will be based on theory syllabus designed as per NEP-2020 guidelines. The theory examination shall be held at the end of each Semester. (In December and May of every academic year)
- a) The pattern of examination will be Semester with Credit and Continuous Internal Evaluation [CIE].
- b) The scheme of the examination will be divided into internal (40 marks) and external assessment as term end examination (60 marks
- c) 4 Credits Course is classified into 60:40 pattern(60 marks theory exam + 40 Marks CIE)
- d) 2 Credits Course is classified into 30:20 pattern (30 marks theory exam + 20 Marks CIE)
- 2.2 The minimum passing marks in each mode of evaluation will be 40 per cent in each course.

2.3 The internal assessment (40 marks) will be done in four stages in each semester as a process of continuous internal evaluation (CIE). Student can give backlog of internal and external examination as per the rules.

There shall be revaluation of Semester end examination (Theory examination) but not internal assessment papers. Candidates may apply for revaluation or rechecking of marks by paying the Revaluation fee or Rechecking fees. Students should submit the rechecking / revaluation form within 15 days after the declaration of the result



2.4 An Internal Evaluation Examination/CIE for 40 Marks (4 Credits Course) shall be as below-

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3. Teaching Hours:

The teaching hours of the faculty/department shall be as per the provisions of clause 15 of the UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education, 2018.

The teaching activities are carried out during 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on working days.

- ii) Post Graduate Diploma after successfully completing TWO semesters with 44 Credits (For those student who are admitted after Three Years of Under Graduate Degree)
- iii) One Year Post Graduate Degree after successfully completing TWO semesters with 44 Credits (For those student who are admitted after Four Years of Under Graduate Degree)

10. Method of Internal Assessment:

Four Assignments per paper, Four Book Reviews, Four Article Writing per paper, Four Article Reviews, Four Classroom Presentations / Four Participation in Seminar conferences, Four Group discussion, Involvement and participation in suitable fieldwork, field visits, study tours or any type of participation relates with the discipline.

Concern faculty will allot an assignment; decide the nature of work accordingly. After the continuous and comprehensive assessment of the student, faculty will give his Grade or Marks Out of 40 marks.

Note: Students must contact the department at the beginning of the semester for the selection of internal assessment method.

11. Examination Instruction For Repeater Students

- Students who have a backlog of the 1st year papers have to fill the backlog form and the fees.
- Students who have a backlog of the 2nd year have to fill the backlog form and the fees.
- Students who have a backlog of both years (1st year and 2nd year) have to fill the backlog from and the fee.

12. Examination Instructions

Vidyapeeth examinations are conducted according to the examination time-table notified by the vidyapeeth by the end of each semester / year. Students are required to appear for written as well as internal evaluation / oral / practical examination as per the course syllabus of their subject.

13. Revaluation & Rechecking / Verification of Marks

Candidates may apply for revaluation or rechecking of marks by paying the Revaluation fee or Rechecking fees. Students should submit the rechecking / revaluation form within 15 days after the declaration of the result.

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14. Class Improvement

Choice Based Credit System was introduced from the year 2024-25 onwards and is currently operational. After passing (all 23 papers) of the M. A. examination, if the students does not get II class he shall be allowed to improve the class of minimum of one or maximum of three papers of both the years under the Class Improvement Scheme of the Vidyapeeth.

15. Results

Results of the Vidyapeeth examinations are declared within 40 days after the end of the examination. The vidyapeeth has the right to reserve the result of a student if he / she has not clearded his / her / other dues.
